The Carmichael Inn, built in 1821, is one of the area's oldest homes.

Throughout its history, the two-story log building, which was originally owned by John Carmichael, served as a residence, stagecoach stop and railroad inn. It served as a stopping point for stagecoach travelers from Nashville, Knoxville and Chattanooga.

In those days, guests would eat with the Carmichael family and then upon retiring for the night, would sleep upstairs in one large room. It was not uncommon for guests to share a bed with others staying at the inn in those days.

The Carmichael Inn and Tavern has been recently renovated by local entrepreneurs Jerry and Louis Ragle (owners of the Historic Loudon Theater) and now offers Southern comfort food in the dining room or patio and a full bar in the sports tavern.
