FUNDING

The Friends of the Tellico Village Library, Inc. (FOTVL) is a non-profit, 501C3 organization dedicated to the support of the library. FOTVL memberships and fundraisers throughout the year are vital to provide revenue to support the library's operating costs. FOTVL pays the mortgage, utilities, insurance, maintenance, and building operating costs.

The library receives an annual stipend from the Tellico Village Property Owners Association and some funding from the Ocoee River Regional Library System. Loudon County pays salaries for a full-time manager and part-time assistant. The library does not receive any funds from a city or county tax base. In 2017, the library's total circulation was 60,365—the highest of the 5 Loudon county libraries.

Library cards are free; simply come to the library with your identification.
